Open Floor:

Beatrice groups – John R. – Does anyone know if they are personally having groups? Howard – Yes, they are having meetings. Sam – If anyone has anyone who is a point of contact please let me know. Steve – There is a whole lot of meetings in Lincoln that are not here in attendance are you going to do the same for them? John – Yes Sam – I just want to make sure we have correct information for Beatrice Chad – I have a meeting here that is called Thursday noon at antlers.

Nic- Budget Submission - Our group voted no on two motions, they were budgets, because we couldn't see what they were being spent on. Kim – As Vice-Chair of activities, we do have an itemized list of things we have done with our money, it has always been said if you want to know what we spend our money on come to activities, we can submit that next month. People do have questions about where are 7th tradition goes, we buy Basic Texts that to give away at our functions. The treasurer does not have a report at this moment. Andrew – I know activities is kind of different because you only use start-up money occasionally, so you're not really using area money. I am not talking about you specifically, its nice to know how the money breaks down. Our groups would like to know how you're going to spend it first. Kim – In regards to that we have an itinerary we put together each year, with about how much. We can't give you exact prices because sometimes pop is on sale sometimes it's not, it does fluctuate.

Steve – Activities Bank Balance – The balance was \$654.89 on 1/31/17. I was wondering why they were not donating some of this amount back to area. Kim – As vice-chair, I don't have any numbers in front of me. We have to put down deposits for events and we don't make money in summer, most things are free, we paid 3-4 months of our rent in advance so we knew that was covered, last year we ran short. We went a couple months last year without paying it. Steve- You can come to area and ask for funds to cover the rent, isn't that the way it reads? Andrew – The part about policy is not in there. It does say they provide \$150.00 if they need it. That is in activities policy, they have a caveat that says that they can keep it if its previously designated. When you say donate it back, it's a little misleading because it didn't come from this area. I don't disagree. They have only used start-up twice, they use their money to fund their activities. It's in their policy not areas. Chad – This probably could have been solved if they followed up with more information. Nic- This would be like our meeting discussion. Kim- Come area next month I will have a report with everything you could want. We will include that our report. John R – The prudent reserve for the activities committee is \$400, any funds over \$400 reserve will be donated to SE NE ASC, unless previously designated. In our ASC guidelines, it says any subcommittee that uses donated funds, must supply monthly reports against their budget, activities is a little different, the only donated funds they use are when they ask for \$150.00 dollars. Sam – They also collect a 7th tradition fund, that is also donated money, every activity has a meeting where they pass a basket. Kim – 7th tradition all goes to literature.

Region business:

Good afternoon SENANA:

Not much to report since we are between regional business meetings. A reminder that there are Open positions @ region and they include:

H&I Chair – Alternate Regional Delegate – Outreach Chair – Policy Chair

As far as General Assembly in January I reported there were CBDM recommendations presented to region and those are recorded below:

Diane K provided copies of CBDM Policies from 3 other Midwest Regions. We broke up into 5 separate workgroups to determine what to recommend to the NRSC. There was unanimous consensus on the following recommendations for CBDM parameters to be included in the Policies:

1. Any member attending the NRSC meeting may participate in the discussion.

2. There will be no required Quorum in order to conduct business. RCM's are responsible for either having a proxy present or arranging to be present using technology such as facetime or teleconference.
3. Any member may make a proposal, but it must be co-sponsored by an RCM, Office, Committee Chair, or RD/ARD
4. Voting membership: for proposals needing a group vote (i.e. financial, policy change etc) only RCM's may vote on straw polls and final polls – for proposals on internal issues (i.e. where to hold the next RSC etc.) RCM's, Officers, RD/RDA, and Committee Chairs may vote on straw polls and final polls.
5. On all proposal, consensus will be reached by “unanimous minus 2” (For example: if there are 8 RCM's eligible to vote, at least 6 must be in favor of the proposal to have consensus.) keep in mind, that if the proposal cannot be developed into an idea that works for the majority through discussion and input by all then perhaps it needs to be tabled or withdrawn.
6. We recommend use of the 3 card system currently being used in the Central Area: red, green and white. Based on the Iowa guidelines and that we incorporate these recommendations into a format that will serve the NRSC Policies. Diane K.

The regional motions that will need your attention will be included in this report if you do not receive the regional minutes or have not retrieved them from the regional website.

Proposal 1: The secretary has a maximum of 30 days to produce the Regional minutes. Submitted by Anita T. **Proposal to be taken back to groups**

Proposal 2: For North Platte to host the April NRSC business meeting at the Masonic Lodge. Submitted by Deborah T. 2nd Mark W

Intent: To allow Great Plains Area to have a fundraiser for NRCNA **Proposal Passed by consensus**

Proposal 3: Fremont would like to host Region on April 8th 2017 at the Berean Church 3rd & C St. Fremont NE Submitted by Gaylan S 2nd Travis W

Intent: NRCNA 34 fundraiser to follow! **Proposal did not pass.**

Proposal 4: Change Policy – Bullet 2 under Subcommittees to read “Chairperson for the sub-committee will be two-year term and clean time requirement of 18 months, with the exception of the Convention Chair, which will have a term from the time they are elected thru the January RSC following the convention they are chairing (typically 2 years, 3 months). Clean time requirement for Convention Chair is 5 years.

Intent: Our Region often has to waive clean time requirements to allow election of a qualified member to chair a sub-committee. Secondly, the convention chair position obviously lasts longer than 1 year, according to our Policy Timelines and Convention Guidelines. When the Convention Guidelines were developed 5 years' clean time was recommended and approved by the Region; however, the main Policy was never adjusted.

Financial Impact: 0 Submitted by Diane K 2nd Gaylan S **Proposal to be taken back to groups.**

Proposal 5: Policy change – Under “Convention” item 3, bullet 1 ADD: “2 conventions cups, 2 convention T-shirts and 1 set of convention CDs will be held out and delivered to the Archives Chair for keepsake.”

Intent: to maintain evidence of our NRCNA history

Financial Impact: \$40.00 max/year Submitted by Diane K 2nd Gaylan S **Proposal to be taken back to groups.**

Proposal 6: Policy change – Under “Convention” item 3, ADD 6th bullet- “*Convention Committee will use the approved Convention Guidelines as a guide to organization of the NRCNA.”

Intent: The NRCNA Guidelines were approved by the Region in July 2010.

Financial Impact: 0 Submitted by Diane K 2nd Gaylan S **Proposal to be taken back to groups.**

Proposal 7: Policy change – Under “Archives Committee” ADD a 2nd bullet under “Purpose...” - *Maintain an adequate and affordable storage space, and be responsible for the key, if applicable. Keys are to be held by Archives Chair, NRSC Chair, and the NRCNA Convention Chair”

Intent: Our Archives Committee has a \$100/year budget, but our Policy does not indicate who is responsible for the storage unit.

Financial Impact: 0 Submitted by Diane K 2nd Gaylan S **Proposal to be taken back to groups.**

Proposal 8: Policy Change: Under “Finances” 7th bullet, CHANGE to “Mandatory expenses: Rent; PO Box; Liability Insurance; Website; Delegate; Officer expenses; Committee expenses.”

Intent: Clarification

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Proposal 9: Policy Change: Under “Miscellaneous” REMOVE the entire 1st bullet – “If an Area has a proposal that needs to be discussed at the next RSC meeting...”

Intent: This Policy has not been followed in many years, and is actually redundant, since it would be difficult to discuss the matter until we meet at the RSC.

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The next region will be April 8th in North Platte with general assembly to start @ noon. Please have your votes turned in to me today or at the very next area. It would be in your best interest to print off a copy of our most current regional policies/guidelines from the regional website. This will aid in the understanding the regional proposals.

CBDM Ad Hoc Report March 2017

We were assembled to gather information on CBDM – Consensus Based Decision Making.

The committee consisted of myself, Sam S., Kimberly R., Shellie H., Ethan, & Nic B

Please allow them to share any other information they may have which I have forgotten to add.

We looked into CBDM and how it works in other areas and regions within this state and the surrounding states. We researched official information from a credible source outside the scope of Narcotics Anonymous.

We have brought forth our findings and they include:

A working definition with how it is tied more to spiritual principles than other ways of doing business

A basic sample Flow Chart

A list of potential FAQ's frequently asked questions.

We have Narcotics Anonymous CBDM information PowerPoints from Sacramento, Dallas, Florida, & Canada. We can also provide current CBDM ASC/Regional Policies from Texas & Colorado in addition to the 4 states we researched.

Definition

What is consensus based decision making? (CBDM)

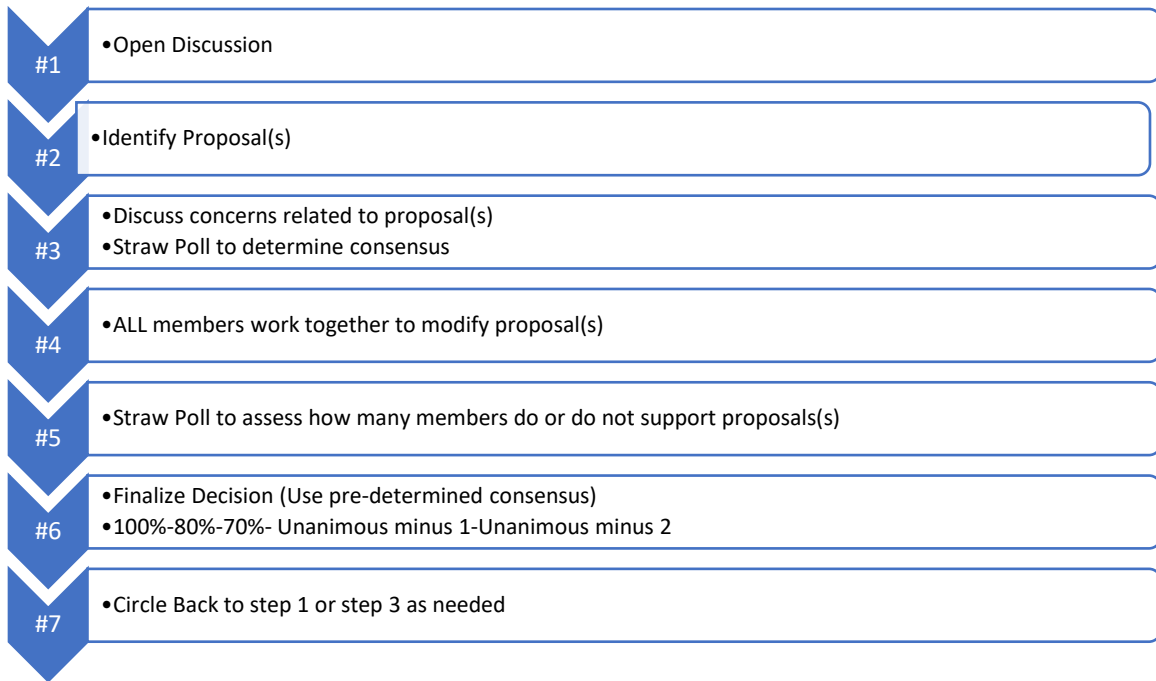
1. It's a way of reaching an agreement between members of a group
2. A group commits to finding solutions that everyone actively supports, or at least can live with.....

How could this affect the way we conduct business in Narcotics Anonymous?

Narcotics Anonymous is spiritual in nature. When we try to achieve a "consensus," we are actually ensuring our service body is following the **9th Concept** "all elements of our service structure have the responsibility to carefully consider ALL viewpoints"

We are also promoting unity by having all members participating, **(Tradition 1)** and invite a loving Higher Power to express Himself in our group conscience, allowing us to serve and not govern. **(Tradition 2)**

Basic SAMPLE Flow Chart of the Process



Consensus Based Decision Making FAQ's

1) Who are the "stakeholders" of a decision?

All the people affected by a decision

2) What increases the likelihood of active participation by group members?

- Ground rules about respect communication
- Facilitator interventions when communication becomes adversarial
- Efficient progress toward resolution of an issue

All of the above

3) Why would we never take a vote on Joe's proposal?

Because all proposals belong to the group, no matter who originated them

4) How much agreement are we trying to get in a consensus process?

We always try for as much agreement as possible

5) Whole Group Thinking is:

When a person is thinking about what might be best for the whole group

6) The facilitator:

Directs the process of the meeting

7) The "vibes watcher":

Monitors the emotional tone of the meeting

makes suggestions about how to address strong feelings in the room

does both of the above

8) The stacker:

Keeps a list of people requesting a chance to speak

9) Participants:

Can contribute to group leadership when they practice
Whole group thinking

10) Important topics:

Should begin with an open discussion

11) A list of needs and concerns:

Can provide criteria for proposals to address

12) Open discussion happens:

By each person taking a turn around the circle

by each person speaking when they are ready

without any particular structure

in any of the above, or other possible formats

13) The goals of open discussion are:

To get everyone's ideas out on the table

to begin identifying all the needs and concerns of the group

to give everyone a chance to participate

all of the above

14) When discussing proposals participants should:

Build a proposal that meets all of the group's concerns as much as possible

15) If you object to a popular proposal, you should:

Ask the group to modify the proposal to address your concerns

16) If only a few people object to a popular idea, the others should:

Listen, and then think creatively about how the concerns of the

Objectors can be better addressed

17) Groups work more collaboratively when:

They address each competing proposal in turn, all working to improve each one

18) Unanimity:

Is the name for the decision rule of groups that require full consent to pass a proposal

The amount of agreement needed to pass a proposal
