<u>Public Relations</u>: Phoneline training was held for "Train the Trainer". We have been having online trainings in between Regions with now a total of approximately 30 volunteers trained for phoneline. **We are still searching for a Phoneline Coordinator** who will be responsible for maintaining the data for the phoneline volunteers and schedules. **We are requesting a 12 Step call list for each area to be submitted to the committee.**

Additional information for your groups:

WCNA: 17,160 paid registrations plus about 1,300 free newcomer registrations. It was a great convention, however, there were way fewer addicts than anticipated. For reference, the WCNA in Orlando (the last WCNA that was held) had over 21,000 registrants. The breakeven point for WCNA 38 was around 24,000 registrations, so there will be a significant loss. There will be discussion about how and if it will be responsible and feasible to move forward with future World Conventions. I am sure we will hear more about that at the interim WSC and certainly have a plan by the in-person WSC in 2026.

Another thing the RD wanted to mention is that NAWS has talked for a long time about the fact that funding World services through literature sales is not sustainable nor probably the best in line with our principles. Through COVID, the fellowship stepped up greatly with individual member and Group/Area/Region donations to NAWS. It would be great to make this the primary way we fund services in NA. **Please consider making recurring donations to NAWS.** I personally donate a dollar for each year I've been clean every month.

November 28th, 2024 – Interim CAR/CAT posted - Remember that your delegate team will be grateful to do CAR/CAT workshops in your area. I am also sure there will be virtual options, and there will be a CAR/CAT workshop accessible via Zoom put on by the PSZF after the reports are made available. The CAR/CAT will be out between this NRSC and the next, and there is a short time between the next Region and the interim WSC. Please don't wait until January's NRSC meeting to try to get a workshop scheduled!

OPEN FLOOR:

Topic #1: Phone Line Coordinator at the Area level?

Creston stated that the ASC will need to find someone to fill the Phone Line Coordinator position. Bekka and Creston are "Trained to Train" a willing service member. The Regional Phone Line Coordinator is a separate position from the Area Phone Line Coordinator. *The following requirements to serve are*: Minimum 2 years of continuous clean time. Must have a working knowledge of the Narcotics Anonymous program. Continued work in the NA Steps and Traditions. 1 year service experience in a public facing position or committee such as a PR/PI/H&I/Phoneline volunteer. A stated willingness to serve. Responsible for all things regarding the phone line. Provide the PR Chair with a monthly report of Helpline activity. Distribute printed or electronic Helpline Handbooks and activity information to volunteers as needed. Communicate with the IT Coordinator

and Outreach Coordinator to ensure that the information given out over the Helpline is current and up to date. Verify all volunteers listed on the Helpline regularly to ensure willingness to continue being of service and accuracy of phone numbers. Provides access to current meeting schedule to helpline volunteers as needed. Check the Helpline regularly to ensure that it is operational. Train new and existing phoneline volunteers. Schedule and facilitate annual phoneline training. Recruit volunteers for meeting list distribution to SENANA groups and all outside agencies or facilities. Works with Outreach Coordinator for accurate NA meeting information within the SENANA area. Actively pursue any new contacts for meeting list distribution and report to Outreach Coordinator and the PR subcommittee. An ability to interact with the public while abiding by the Twelve Traditions and Twelve Concepts of NA.

Topic #2: ASC Records (Treasurer)

Dennis asked if the ASC has any Treasurer's financial records or statements prior to 2022. Dennis also asked if the Treasurer could use the Activities' storage space to store records/archives. Members of the ASC suggested that Dennis use electronic storage, which he stated would not be ideal for audits. Mariah W. stated the Activities subcommittee has room to store records. Dennis stated policy requires there to be an audit when Treasurer duties are passed along to a new trusted servant. Steven will help Dennis complete this within the next month or two.
