## **Worldwide NA Fellowship & NA World Services (NAWS) Updates**

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### **Strategic Planning: A Collaborative Process**

The February 2025 Interim World Service Conference (WSC) marked a historic shift: for the first time, the entire conference body is collectively creating the NAWS Strategic Plan for 2026–2029. This effort is organized around four key result areas:

1. Public Relations
2. Service System Support
3. Fellowship Support
4. World Service Structure and Operations

Each area includes draft issues and objectives (but not yet solutions). These were informed by inventory sessions, Zonal input, surveys, and breakout group discussions.

Key themes discussed:

- Credibility of NA
- Safety and belonging in service
- Virtual NA and service delivery
- Harm reduction
- Generational/cultural differences
- The sustainability of NAWS

- The future of the World convention

The Strategic Plan draft is on pages 6–7 of the February 2025 Planning Report.

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## **Conference Motions – Summary of Decisions**

All key motions at the Interim WSC 2025 passed by consensus support. These included:

- Approval of the 2023 WSC minutes
- Approval of the 2025–2026 NAWS budget
- Adoption of a revised CAR survey process for the 2026 cycle
- Extension of the reimbursement policy through 2026
- Adjustment to amendment submission deadlines. This included an amendment on Motion 6 offered from the (virtual) floor that moved the deadline for finalized amendments from 30 days to 45 days before the in-person WSC. The World board also agreed to wait a bit longer after the amendment deadline before putting out the initial straw poll for WSC motions the delegates will vote on.
